SUBJECT: FISCAL YEAR 2013-2014 AUDITED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR 25 OF THE 126 CHARTER SCHOOLS IN OPERATION AT YEAR-END

Ladies and Gentlemen:

We are in the process of reviewing the June 30, 2014 financial statement audits of the 126 M-DCPS sponsored charter schools in operation as of year-end. The review of said audits is one of the primary mechanisms used by the District for fiscal oversight of its charter schools pursuant to section 1002.33, Florida Statutes. This process includes reviewing year-end financial statements and associated documents for charter schools that have been audited by their own contracted external audit firms. During these reviews our office corresponds, when necessary, with the schools' management and external auditors to better understand or clarify any germane fiscal issues. Our work product herein is considered a non-audit service according to Government Auditing Standards.

For purposes of the May 12, 2015, ABAC meeting, we are presenting to you the audited financial statements for the following 25 charter schools, which are all under the legal entity, Mater Academy, Inc. We had presented 89 charter school financial statement audits at the December 2014, January 2015 and March 2015 ABAC meetings and plan to present the remaining twelve at the July 2015 ABAC meeting.

Based on their external audits, 22 Mater or SLAM schools presented herein are free of significant fiscal concerns. We have some concerns which are pending clarification and guidance from the Florida Department of Education for three Mater schools as outlined below.

In our review of the aforementioned certified financial statements, we noted that \$2,987,000 had been transferred from the three above schools to Mater Academy, Inc. (Corporate Account) as long-term, non-interest advances as follows:

The schools' Governing Board accommodated our request to satisfy our audit function requirement of transparency, and determining where those funds were ultimately expended, by providing us with Special Purpose Schedules and Auditor's Report dated April 16, 2015. According to said report, the monies were further advanced and expended as follows:

As previously communicated, we are not clear as to the propriety or legality of a charter school transferring FEFP funding to a "corporate account" and/or another charter school governed by the same legal entity when no goods, services or deliverables are provided in exchange by the receiving school (or entity). We have requested clarification and guidance on this matter from the Florida Department of Education, and are awaiting an official response.
